Background and context

After 5 years, time to update: developments in legislation and technology, current thinking on copyright

new provisions introduced, some amendments

2009: amended and improved WIPO draft law - EIFL document follows the structure of the WIPO draft law (as it was then)

reasonable and common sense provisions needed for today's libraries and their users

free uses only i.e. free of charge and free of permission

since 2009, used by librarians in EIFL partner countries when laws are being amended
